Pastor's Notes

Dear Parishioners,

FORGIVENESS=the act of ceasing to feel resentment against an offender. This is one of the definitions in Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary. I find it interesting that the Church gives us four lessons about forgiveness in our Scripture readings today. Moses encourages God to show Mercy to the Hebrew people who worshiped a false god. St. Paul witnesses in I Timothy about how if God can forgive him and use Paul for Christ's service, God can redeem anyone. In Luke's Gospel, we have the Parable of the Prodigal Son, where the loving father forgives the greedy and wasteful son who returns and the older son who felt cheated and entitled.

In our "eye for an eye", "just sue 'em", "they'll never get away with that," "you can't talk to me like that," "make 'em pay" society, it is difficult to preach forgiveness. However, two members of Major League Baseball taught an important lesson to all of the nation nine

On June 2, 2010, in the days before umpire replay review, pitcher Armando Galarraga of the Detroit Tigers and umpire Jim Joyce showed how to handle mistakes and how to forgive. With two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning, Galarraga is one out away from a perfect game. There is a close play on a ground ball at first base. Umpire Jim Joyce calls the base runner "safe". The replay clearly showed the runner to be "out". A perfect game is lost and turns into a one-hit shut-out.

After the game, the umpire personally reviews the call on video replay and admits his mistake. "He [Joyce] understands," Armando Galarraga said. "I give him a lot of credit for coming in and saying, 'Hey, I need to talk to you to say I'm sorry.' That doesn't happen. You don't see an umpire after the game come out and say, 'Hey, let me tell you I'm sorry.' He apologized to me and he felt really bad. He didn't even shower [first]. He was in the same clothes. He gave me a couple hugs. He apologized. He feels really bad." "Nobody is perfect," Galarraga said. "What am I gonna do? His body language said more than a lot of words. His eyes were watery, he didn't have to say much. His body language said a lot."

It is refreshing to see genuine acts of forgiveness. I know this is just a baseball game. In this scope of life or solving the world's problems this was a minor event. Mr. Gallarraga held no resentment toward the umpire. He didn't bad-mouth the umpire in the press. The Detroit Tigers fans applauded the umpire when Mr. Joyce walked back onto the field the next day and again the umpire was physically moved by the gesture. No riots in the stands or streets and there were no highway billboards pointing out the error of "The Call." It was just two men and two teams that went back to playing another game the next day. Forgiveness has the power to change men's hearts and it can change the world if we let it.

The resentments and grudges we carry weigh us down and can even make us sick. Turn to the Lord for forgiveness by walking into His outstretched arms and ask Jesus to help you to forgive. It can change your world! Prayers and Blessings,
