I pray that you have a good and Happy St. Valentine's Day this week. It is essential that we take time to tell the ones we love how important their relationship is to us. Sometimes we take for granted the ones we love the most and do not express our appreciation to them for how they enrich our lives. Chocolate, candy, flowers, a dinner out, jewelry, and gadgets are nice expressions of our love, but those material things need to be supported with the actual words and actions of love that we share with each other.

This holiday takes place on St. Valentine's Day! In our "politically correct" nation, the word "saint" has been dropped to make the holiday more secular. But the tradition developed around two martyred saints of the Catholic Church — yes, two saints named Valentine. One was a priest who was known to be martyred on February 14, around the year 269 AD. The other was a bishop named Valentine martyred sometime around the year 273 AD. It is presumed that the dates of their martyrdoms were celebrated on the same day because they had the same name. The practice of giving Valentines and the act of young men and maidens choosing each other to "Be My Valentine" on this day is derived from an English tradition. It is presumed, based on popular belief which was recorded in one of Chaucer's books, that birds began to pair on St. Valentine's Day. I hope you will use this week not only to tell your Valentine that you love them, but to also express your love for all who are special to you.

Treasures from our Tradition

The song of the angels, "Holy, Holy," resounds from our lips at every Mass. There was a widespread belief in the first religions of the world that God stirred creation into being by a word, a song, a musical note. Music and a sense of God's presence have always been inseparable.

In the liturgy, your voice is invited into this song as the priest names the reasons for our praise. "Heaven and earth are full of Your glory," and we are not passive onlookers, but participants in this glory. Catholic prayer no longer assigns this angelic hymn to a choir, but gives it to you to sing.

Even if your voice is thought to be suitable only for a well-insulated shower stall, you are called into this song. We are born to sing – just listen to a baby testing the full range of newly-discovered vocal abilities! Soon we get shushed and hushed into quiet, and given lots of messages that our voices are unwanted, and that we need to raise our hands in order to be heard.
