Dear Parishioners.

The Solemnities of Ascension and Pentecost are celebrated just a week apart and close the Easter Season. Today's solemnity is rooted in the mission of Jesus Christ. Those left behind, following Jesus' glorious Ascension into heaven, must carry on the mission. Jesus will guide his disciples through the Holy Spirit until Christ returns in glory at the end of time. The Solemnity of Pentecost celebrates the fulfillment of Jesus' promise to send the Holy Spirit to the Church to act as teacher, counselor, advocate, and helper – the one who will show us how to speak the words of faith. These solemnities at the end of the Easter season give us the grace to live our Catholic faith in the modern world. The physical body of Jesus left the earth but His spiritual presence is always with us.

Let your prayer this week reflect on the gifts of the Holy Spirit and how God is calling you to use these gifts you have been given. The Gifts of the Holy Spirit are: WISDOM, KNOWLEDGE, UNDERSTANDING, FORTITUDE (or Courage), RIGHT JUDGEMENT, PIETY (or Reverence), and FEAR OF THE LORD (or Wonder and Awe).

At the end of Mass the deacon or priest sends us forth from Mass by saying; "Go in the peace of Christ to love and serve the Lord." We are commissioned at that moment to go out into the world and cooperate with and extend the mission of Christ. We have just received our God in Holy Communion. Now we are to bring Christ to the world. Jesus left that work for us to do when He ascended into heaven with the help of the Advocate, the Holy Spirit. What an honor it is to be ambassadors of Christ. And so we respond, "Thanks be to God."

From the Chancery

We continue to pray for all who are impacted by the natural disasters this year, both the tornadoes that hit Cole, Hickory, Miller and Randolph counties this past week, and the flooding of major rivers in our Diocese. Counties impacted by that flooding include Boone, Callaway, Camden, Chariton, Clark, Cole, Gasconade, Howard, Lewis, Linn, Maries, Marion, Miller, Moniteau, Monroe, Montgomery, Morgan, Osage, Pettis, Phelps, Perry, Pike, Ralls, Randolph and Saline.

Catholic Charities of Central and Northern Missouri, an agency of our Diocese, is working with other agencies to ensure a coordinated and integrated network of support is provided to those affected. If you or your parish group would like to volunteer, please contact United Way at 2-1-1. It is serving as the central clearinghouse to match immediate needs with resources.

As Catholic Charities did in response to the 2017 floods, it is putting in place a process to assist those who have a very fragile safety net; people without insurance, who are not homeowners, on limited income, with disabilities, or whose livelihood has been impacted by the natural disaster.
