Dear Parishioners,

Congratulations, Graduates! Graduations are great times to stop and reflect on where one has been and to look to the future. Our College graduations were last week. Our Holy Rosary School graduation was Tuesday. Congratulations to our High School Graduates of 2019 this weekend.

Often the busy-ness of life means that we go from one thing to the next without much reflection on how we have been guided by God's grace and grown in wisdom, knowledge and understanding of our God, ourselves, and the world. Let us pray for all of our Graduates of 2019 that they may be guided by the Holy Spirit in their new endeavors.

Graduations and the end of school bring us to the unofficial start of Summer. (Next weekend is Memorial Day already.) Remember Mass and our prayer relationship with God during summertime activities.
