Dear Parishioners,

Within the last month you have received a letter from Bishop McKnight asking for your contribution to the diocesan Catholic Stewardship Appeal (CSA). If you have not responded with your contribution, next Sunday is our In-Pew Appeal. Please contribute. The CSA supports the work of our diocesan offices and services to our parish. As we go about our business in both parishes most parishioners do not realize how often our parishes utilize the diocesan offices. In one way or another, our parish is in contact with the diocese at least three times in a week. The Vocation Office continues to seek out candidates for priesthood and religious life as well as supporting our 9 seminarians in four different seminaries. The Youth Office provides training for our youth ministers and organizes the very successful and popular Totus Tuus program we hosted again this summer in our parishes. The Youth Office organizes the trip to the National Catholic Youth Conference (NCYC) in Indianapolis, Indiana at the end of this month. Eight youth from our parishes will travel with 500 youth from our diocese to be with 25,000 Catholic youth from across the USA.

We have used the assistance of the Finance Office frequently, and especially this year, as we are refining our parish accounting procedures. Our parish secretaries often call the Finance Office for guidance with reports and hiring of employees.

In our parishes, Deacon Mike Long's on-going training and retreats are sponsored by the Office for the Diaconate. Our Diocese is one of only two dioceses in the country that the Office of the Tribunal does not charge to process an annulment (the cost to others is \$500 or more.) Sr. Sue and Mrs. Albus are often working with the Diocesan School Office. The Office of Stewardship guides us on how to use our gifts and talents wisely as well as helping our parishioners support their parish financially through tithing and estate planning. This office sends you the material for CSA.

Please contribute to this appeal as you did so generously last year. You do not have to contribute a lot and you can pay your contribution over 10 months. One percent of your income is a practical suggestion. It will be beneficial to our parish if we meet our parish goals. Ten percent of the money we collect will be given back to our parishes which I intend to put toward capital improvements. Any amount that is collected over our goal, the parishes will receive 90% back to the parishes. Please support the mission of our parish by supporting the Catholic Stewardship Appeal.
